

GROUP QUESTIONS

When is the last time you were in a conversation where HOW something was said was more important than WHAT was said?

Read John 11:1-44

- What surprises you about Jesus' reaction to the news that Lazarus is sick?
- What surprises you about Jesus' actions once He arrives in Bethany?

Know Your Audience

Each person or group Jesus speaks to, He interacts with them differently. From His disciples to Martha, to Mary, to the Jews at large.

- Why is important to consider who you are talking to before you talk?
- What kind of things would be helpful to consider?

Enter into the Pain

• How does Jesus interact with each person or groups pain differently?

Read Proverbs 18:13 & 1 Corinthians 13:1-7

- Have you ever experiened someone entering into your pain vs. just telling you how to feel? How impactful was each approach?
- What are some ways we can enter into others pain and provide comfort?

Give Hope

• Jesus provides different facets of the same hope to each person or group. What are the facets, and what is the central hope?

Christianity has been called the "Something Happened" religion, because we don't base our hope solely on words written down but on the truth that at one point we were one way and then 'Something Happened' and we were transformed. And while each experience has different details, the central theme in them all is the Resurrection of Jesus and His resurrection of us.

What is your story? How did Jesus know you, enter your pain, and give you up?
