Week 5 - Building with Justice

GROUP QUESTIONS

Read Micah 6:8

What does the Bible mean by the word justice? *Mishpot* - to treat people equitably. Justice is giving people what they are due.

- Do you tend to think of justice in the positive sense (treat people equitably) or the negative sense (punishment)?
- So much of true justice, or determining what people are due, starts with which perspective and posture we take towards the value of other people. Do we see other people as being due respect, kindness, and love, no matter what they believe, or their status?

Read Zechariah 7:9-10 & Matthew 11:4-5

- What example are we given of living out God's standard of justice through Jesus?
- We all from time to time miss opportunities to show justice and mercy. What usually hinders you from it?
- What could you do to being to shift your perspective and posture to seeing others as being due kindness, mercy, compassion and love?
- What injustice tugs at your heart the most when you see it or hear it? Why do you think that is? What could you do to bring justice to the situation?

Read Zechariah 5:1-19

- What injustice does Nehemiah see and hear? What is his response?
- Generosity is most readily tied to finances, and this is true, but what are some other things we can be generous with towards others?
- When have you experience someone being generous towards you?
